WHAT IS THE GOAL AND HOW WILL YOU GET TO THAT GOAL?



...more than a buzzword

- Q. What are some of the emphases, materials, books, plans or training that impacted your own development as a disciple?
- Q. Who was someone who helped you to become a better disciple? What was happening in your life. Why were they important?

IMPORTANCE OF A PATHWAY

Develop a path or plan to intentionally raise up disciples who make disciples.

Start with the end in mind

"DISCIPLESHIP IS TAKING THE NECESSARY TIME TO WIN, INVOLVE, AND TEACH SOMEONE HOW TO FOLLOW JESUS."

A relationship with purpose

"So, being affectionately desirous of you, we were ready to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you had become very dear to us." - 1 Thessalonians 2:8

• This is where I am going. Come and go WITH me.

What methods do YOU use in your own development and study?

- QUESTIONS: Is there a command to be obeyed, a sin to avoid, a teaching about God or self?
- GOAL ORIENTATION:
 - a. Marks of Discipleship
 - b. 4 Chair Discipleship: am I discipling non-/ new / growing / disciple-making Christians?:
 - c. Where is this student now? Where am I trying to take them / where do they need to be?
- ESSENTIALS

a. Prayer

b. Study of the word

c. Marks of maturity

Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing. - 1 Thessalonians 5:11

Building one another? Seeing growth? Victory over sin?

DISCIPLESHIP GAME PLAN: a Relationship of Purpose- "disciples who make disciples"

- 7. What are some examples of how you have personalized discipleship to particular students' readiness for next-level challenges?
- 8. What particular student(s) have come to mind as you think through your discipling Game Plan? Why them? What might be done to help you make discipleship more personal to them? ...for you to be more present to them? ...for you to open up your life to them?
